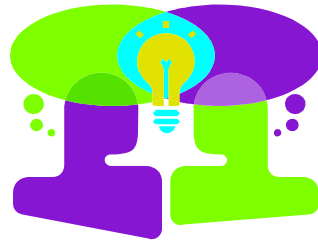


# The World Bank Muddies the Water in Ghana

## Additional Ideas Page



Here's a few ways you can modify this play to suit it to your group and audience!

- If you don't have any African music, use any hard surface as a drum and have someone thump out a catchy beat while Madam Atuko gathers her water.
- Invite your priest or school principal to act as a Signer or the D&P member!
- Have the Speaker sign the card at the end, too.
- Give the Speaker a bottle of water as a prop, symbolizing part of the problem.
- Have two people play the role of the D&P member and just alternate the lines.
- Have "big strings" in the Speaker's pockets that you can pull out when talking about the conditions of the World Bank loans. You can even attach pieces of paper to them saying "Increase Prices!", "Must Privatize!", "Full cost recovery!" or "Unfair Conditions!"
- Have activists carrying signs who enter and exit at appropriate times.

Some ideas for slogans:

- "Water: Life Before Profit!"
- "Madam Atuko has a right to Water!"
- "Human Right or Commodity?"
- "Team up With D&P!"
- Each of the four statements on the Action Card:
  - "Stop placing unfair conditions on loans!"
  - "Work to strengthen the role of the public sector!"
  - "Support citizen's groups!"
  - "Ensure access to clean, affordable water!"



Be creative.

Explore different ways of sending a visual message to your audience. Play around with the script itself (making sure your message is still consistent with D and P materials). Find ways of making it personal for you.

Most of all,
